Sunflower Farm

Finished quilt size: 37½" x 56½"

Fabric Requirements

One panel (2/3 yard) Farm-C6475 Sunflower
1/3 yard Gail-C5495 Black
12/3 yards Fleur-C5254 Black
1/2 yard Stripe-C8109 Black for binding
22/3 yards backing fabric of your choice
46" x 65" batting

Cutting

From Farm-C6475 Sunflower:

- Trim the panel to 22 1/2" x 41 1/2".

From Gail-C5495 Black:

- Cut four 2" x width-of-fabric (WOF) border strips. Sub-cut two 2" x 41 1/2" side borders and two 2" x 25 1/2" top/bottom borders.

From Fleur-C5254 Black:

- Referring to the quilt photo, fussy-cut four 6 1/2" x length-of-fabric (LOF) border strips.

From Stripe-C8109 Black:

- Cut five 2 1/2" x WOF binding strips.

Quilt Top Assembly

All seam allowances are 1/4" and pieces are sewn right sides together.


1. Sew one 2" x 41 1/2" C5495 Black strip to each side of the C6475 Sunflower panel. Press seam allowances toward the borders.
2. Sew one 2" x 25 1/2" C5495 Black strip to the top and another to the bottom. Press seam allowances toward the border.
3. Mark the center of the 6 1/2" x LOF C5254 Black border strips and the center of each quilt top side, top and bottom. Noting the print orientation, match the border centers to the quilt top center marks. Sew all four borders strips, starting and stopping stitching exactly 1/4" from the corner edge. DO NOT cut off the extra fabric length.
4. To miter the borders, fold one corner of the quilt on a 45° angle so that the border strips are directly on top of one another and the seams nest together. Place your rotary ruler on the fold of the quilt so that

the long edge is against the fold and the 45° line is on the side seam. Draw a line from the corner of the quilt top to the outside edge of the border. Pin the borders together.

Position your needle on the inside corner where the border meets the quilt. Stitch directly on the line you have drawn to the outside edge of the border.

Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press. Repeat the process for the remaining three corners of the quilt (*figure 1*).

Finishing

5. Layer the wall hanging top, batting and backing, and quilt as desired.
6. Stitch the binding strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Fold and press the resulting long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together. Stitch to the wall hanging front, matching raw edges and mitering the corners.
7. Fold the binding to the wall hanging underside and hand-stitch the folded edge to the back.
